As a member of, the County you are expected to abide by the following code of practice:

- All members must take responsibility in ensuring they are up to date with the rules, understand and adhere to them. This includes a current DBS.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity.
- Members should recognise the valuable contribution made by coaches, umpires and officials who are usually volunteers. They give their time and resources to provide bowls for their members.
- All members must respect officials and publicly accept their decisions.
- All members should be a positive role model, treat other players and officials with the same level of respect you would expect to be shown to you.
- Use correct and proper language at all times.
- Members are not permitted to smoke within any venues used by the County. They will also be required to abide by the club's smoking policy.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for coaching and competitions and endeavour to inform the relevant parties if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable footwear on the green, as per each clubs rules. County rules state that sandals cannot be worn for County Matches/Competitions.
- Bullying of any sort will not be tolerated.
- Encourage everyone to enjoy sport and understand that people have different motivations for taking part.
